### Antivirus 2009 - Scam

This might be one of the best scams of the year. Not only does it look good, but they are using a logo that looks a lot like the Windows Security logo.

This scam will hit you when you exit your Internet Browser. A popup will appear as **THIS**, and then when you click to close, or cancel it, more browser windows will open and it will appear to be scanning your computer for viruses. It will tell you that it found problems and that you need to download this program. After you download it, you will be asked to pay approximately \$45. You can keep on putting it off, but it has already loaded spyware on your computer that will need to be removed by a computer technician.

If you don't have this spyware removed, you will experience your computer being slower, and still have the potentially dangerous spyware loaded on your computer.

## Delivery Status Notification - **Scam**

There has been an email going around that will most likely look like it is coming from yourself!

The subject line will be:

**Delivery Status Notification**

**Delivery Status Notification (Failure)**

**RE: Message**

**RE: Order Status**

The message will either be a large picture ad for unwanted items, or it will have text that says:

**“having problems viewing this message, click here.”**

Or it will say if you want more details, you need to click on a link to take you to a website.

These are spam messages - Please use your delete key when finding such messages.
